IDENTITY TRAPS: PSYCHOLOGY OF CONTEMPORARY DISCRIMINATION 12:30 PM – 2:00 PM

Dr. Goff will discuss some of the most exciting findings in his time as President of the Center for Policing Equity at UCLA; for instance, how the fear of appearing racist can be more deadly for young Black men than racism, how the defense of manhood can endanger everyone, and, most surprising of all, how police chiefs and sheriffs are the ones clamoring the most for more of this research. While focusing on the case of law enforcement, this research has broad implications for the ways that individuals encounter race and racism in other settings, including in higher education.
